We thank them all for the sacrifices and losses they took upon themselves to preserve the safety and rights of all those in the United States. The program ends with a gun salute and rising of the flag during taps.

The last of the spring hikes beginning at 2 p.m. (change to 4 p.m. due to the heat of the day for the next three months) was on Sunday, May 27 when eight Springwater Trail's hikers attended. Planned by Saralinda, the hike was along the Rails to Trails area from Naples to Middlesex with the social at the Naples Community Park. The wild flowers were abundant and most of the trail was easy walking on flat terrain on the old rail bed, with only one area along the seven mile route being very muddy. The phlox in purple and white, yellow and blue iris, violets, buttercups, cattails and skunk cabbage could be seen along the banks. Frogs were scurrying along where the grasses and weeds were high. Nesting turtles were not spotted, but evidence was everywhere along the trail.
