The Springwater Community Food Pantry is open on Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 PM and on Saturdays from 9:00 to 11:00 AM. We still could use donations of sugar, flour, baking products, peanut butter, jelly or jam, cereal, pancake mix, syrup, bread, etc. Donations can be dropped off during these hours. Thank you.

At this time Food Link still has not given us a date for October."

Eight Springwater Trail's hikers enjoyed the beauty of the little known Patriot Park. Patriot Park was acquired as a donation from Ontario County by the town of Bristol. The park spans 12.6 acres and is located on the south side of CR 32, just west of Mud Creek. Due to generous donations of a picnic table, many benches along the way, and much time and labor, the park's trail system is well-equipped and easy to navigate. This Sunday October 13 we will visit East Hill Farm near Middlesex, home of the Rochester Folk Art Guild, for a hike across a 350-acre hilltop farm and woodlot and a tour of the craft workshops. The Guild is a community of craftspeople, some resident and some visiting, and the weekend of October 12-13 is their annual fall Apple Festival and Open House, a celebration of the season with a home-cooked Farm lunch, local food vendors, fresh pressed cider, and tours/demonstrations at the pottery, wood, weaving and graphic arts studios. The Gallery/gift shop is also open for business. Admission is free, and the event runs until 5 PM. The group will meet early at 1:00 PM. More details are available on the Springwater Trail's website or ask a regular hiker.

Respite Care is temporary care to relieve a primary caregiver from care-giving responsibilities. There are several options for respite care in Livingston County, including in-home care, adult day programs and social programs. Respite can be provided in-home or away from home. Dansville Respite Care is offered at the Dansville United Methodist Church, 5 Chestnut Rd. Dansville. Caregivers drop their loved ones off at a safe and friendly environment staffed by trained volunteers who provide one to one companionship and socialization. Hours are 10 am – 2 pm on the FIRST and THIRD Thursdays. Your loved one can stay for a short while or for the full four hours. No cost; donations accepted.
