This week I had the pleasure of visiting with Mark Walker. He was born November 16, 1957 at the old Wayland Hospital that closed in 1964 of parents Marian (Warner) and Burl Walker. Mark's favorite birthday recollection was of his 16th birthday on the 16th of November 1973, the day he could obtain a deer license. His brothers were Dick Walker born in 1947 (school teacher near Ithaca passed away), and his brother Don Walker (dairy farming in Springwater) born in 1949. Mark was Springwater Town Supervisor from 2000 to 2007 and was mentored by his father (Burl, who served as Springwater Town Assessor and on the Town Board for many years) and by Town Supervisor Howard Kramer. Mark lived in Batavia for 6 years, married Sue Wagner from Loon Lake on October 20, 1984 at St. Joseph's Church in Wayland. They have two children, both working and living in Virginia at this time. Catherine Walker was born December 7, 1986 and Daniel Walker was born June 16, 1989. Catherine works for the National Science Foundation and Dan is a Field Engineer for Hanley Energy. Mark's hobbies include hunting, playing basketball, and traveling with his wife. Some of the favorite places they have been include Austria, Hawaii, Key West FL, Sedona AZ, and Virginia.
