Then Sunday, July 12, I was able to purchase just picked fresh peas to freeze for this coming winter from Hargrave Farms, Route 21 between Wayland and Atlanta, as I had let Greg Hargrave know I was interested in fresh peas and he called to let me know they were ready. In case you have never done so, you can let your farm marketers know you are interested in a certain crop and to let you know when the crop is at its peak. Most are willing to let you know.

At Webster's Crossing United Methodist Church this past Sunday, July 12th, Pastor Dorothy's sermon was enjoyed outside near the playground at the 9 AM service. An Ad Council meeting is set for July 8, Wednesday, at 6 PM, where details of the Spaghetti Dinner Take-Out for the 4th Thursday in July will be finalized.
