Those who entered learned the artists are readying the wood-fired kiln for firing and a show on March 4 – 7 by Emma Silverstein. This was my first snowshoe hike, as Denise loaned me her snowshoes and Saralinda loaned me her poles. There is something to do everyday of the week at the Little Lakes Community Center, 4705 S. Main St. in Hemlock. Therefore, if you enjoy socializing, are willing to attend and contribute to their sustainability look into their website at www.littlelakesny.org. The first Monday of every month you have the opportunity to meet with the organizers of the Little Lakes Community Association; not just to listen, but to actually participate.
