The hike at Keuka Lake State Park planned by Saralinda for Sunday, October 7 was enjoyed by 10 people. We broke into two groups, seven in the Tourist Group led by Cassie, and 3 in the Bicycling Group led by Saralinda. The weather was a cool 50 degrees F and the hike was up and up to the top of the hill and then back down to the lake. The bicycle ride was a long one taking from 2 to 3 hours. It was around to the inner point bluff and back. Springwater Trails' next hike on October 14th 2018, planned by John will cover several trails on Hatch Hill in Naples; the Fall colors should be at the finest for this hike. The hike will start at the Bob North Bridge at the bottom of Ontario Street in Naples. There is a kiosk and a small parking lot there, and all groups will start at the same place. The Naturalists will walk along Matt's Meander to the Naples

Community Park and back, while the Tourists will walk south along Hatch Hill above the town to the south end of Naples. The Climbers will walk north on Hatch Hill to Conklin Gully. Both Tourists and Naturalists will walk back to the parking lot, while Climbers will end up at the DEC parking area at the bottom of Conklin Gully and be shuttled back to Naples. Note: the last half mile of this hike is a very steep downhill, but it's worth it; there are huge drops into the gully to the right of the trail, and wonderful views across the gully and down into it. There is a DEC display board at the parking lot with a map of all the trails that meet there; all the day's hiking trails are shown. The social will take place at the Neapolitan Pizzeria in downtown Naples.

Some people gratefully embraced the message and others rejected it out of disbelief. After the first missionary journey Paul and Barnabas had words and Barnabas left. Linda Hopkins, Springwater Representative to the Livingston County for the Aging Advisory Council, writes there is a Home Safe Home program available through funding from Office for the Aging and United Way, provided by Lifespan, and managed by UR Medicine/Noyes Health. Home Safe Home provides an in-home safety assessment and minor home modifications, including installation of grab bars and/or railings inside the home; mobility assistive equipment such as shower chairs and / or raised toilet seats. Eligibility requirements include: Livingston County resident, 60+ years old or under 60 and disabled, income less than \$38,000 a year. For in-home safety contact Tara at Noyes Health 585-335-4359. A safe home environment reduces risk of trips and falls. In addition, Linda writes about the Caregiver Support Group that will meet monthly starting on Tuesday, October 16 from 2 – 3 PM at Noyes Memorial Hospital.
