The order of worship went as follows: the Prelude, Scripture sentences read by the Minister and the people, a Hymn, Call to Confession, General Confession, Prayer of Pardon, the Lord's Prayer, singing, lesson from the Old Testament, singing, lesson from the New Testament, singing, Declaration of Faith, Collect for Grace said by all, Prayer, the Offertory, Sermon, and Benediction. There definitely were changes made from 1905 to 1939. Everyone have a good week.

Pat also mentioned "Due to the weather and cold temperatures last week the Springwater Community Food Pantry was closed Wednesday evening. The closing was put on WHEC-TV Channel 10. If the time should come that there is bad weather again please check WHEC-TV to see if it is listed as being closed before you leave your home. Otherwise we are open regular hours on Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 PM and Saturdays from 9 to 11AM except for when the Food Link truck is in town." Donations to the Springwater Community Food Pantry are gladly accepted during these hours. Although to qualify for assistance income guidelines and proof of identification with current address in the Wayland Cohocton School District are needed, a one-time emergency situation may be filled.
