The next hike on **Sunday, November 14th** will visit and hike a little-known gem nestled in the town of Bristol –

Patriot Park – this Sunday. Patriot Park was acquired as a donation from Ontario County by the town of Bristol. The park spans 12.6 acres and is located on the south side of CR 32, just west of Mud Creek. Due to generous donations of a picnic table, many benches along the way, and much time and labor the park’s trail system is well-equipped and easy to navigate. There are four small trails winding into each other for a total of just over 2 miles. This is an easy walk – most of it is flat with the exception of the Uplands Trail, which is a gentle slope of about 5 minutes in length. To join the group, log into the Springwater Trails website for details or ask a regular hiker.

If you are a history buff, you may like to attend **the Springwater Webster Crossing Historical Society program** on the **History of the Webster's Crossing United Methodist Church on location**. The church was built in 1909 with a dated cornerstone. In 2009, then Pastor Jeri Kober was instrumental in leading the congregation to open the time capsule hidden under the cornerstone discovered only two weeks before the celebration. The Church historian since 1966 will present with the help of her family, friends, and those who come and have recollections of what has transpired. These include the pastors, the lay people, and the present. The program will be on **Tuesday, November 23** at 6:30 PM for the Dish-to-pass Dinner in the fellowship hall and 7:15 PM for the presentation in the Sanctuary. Before and after, there will be a tour of the church to see the cornerstone and to view the artifacts on the walls like the quilt prepared for the 100th anniversary and the items that were in the tin box found under the cornerstone, as well as photographs of the people involved over the years.

Rueda de Casino is a group Salsa dance from Cuba. Think Square Dancing meets Salsa. The first 45 - 60 minutes is learning oriented, with frequent stops to learn the moves and to improve details. The next 30 - 45 minutes is "flow" oriented, only stopping between songs. The last 30 minutes is for socializing. A variety of Salsa, Bachata, and Merengue music is played for anyone's dancing pleasure.
